# To All Parents and Stakeholders,

Tuscumbia City Schools had a great first semester and this is due to the support you provide to our system and for this, I say thank you. We are growing in so many areas and your support is bolstering this growth. Here are a few highlights and reminders as we begin the second semester of the 2023-2024 school year.

- 1. 2023-2024 State Report Card
  - o System Score 87
  - o Deshler High School 82
  - o Deshler Middle School 83
  - o RE Thompson 85
  - o GW Trenholm 85
  - O As a whole, the system is pleased with our scores and especially proud of our students, staff, and administrators for showing growth in all areas of the report card. Our goal next year is a 90.

## 2. Attendance Counts

- We understand that there are times when students need to miss school, please limit these as much as possible. As a reminder, a student who misses 18 or more days in a school year is considered Chronically Absent per the Alabama State Board of Education and affects our report card score.
- o If a student must miss school, please send in a parent, medical, or other excuse. State law requires all school systems to report students who have missed over 7 days unexcused to the Juvenile Court System of Alabama.
- 3. Here are a few highlights the system and schools have already accomplished this year.
  - o K-3 students had a 90% literacy rate which is 14 points above the state average.
  - Tuscumbia City Schools saw a 6.5% increase in student enrollment over the past two years. This is the 3<sup>rd</sup> highest in the state.
  - 100% System Academic Growth and a 5-point increase on Academic Achievement on the 2022-2023 report card.
  - o 33% passing rate on Advanced Placement tests, up 14% from last year.

### 4. Child Nutrition

- O As a reminder, per our Board Policy, please refrain from bringing outside food into our cafeterias in the original packaging. Policy states, The State of Alabama Policy for Competitive Foods, Alabama Healthy Snack Standards for Foods and Beverages at School, and Vending Machine Policy will be enforced at all schools. In accordance with these policies, foods and beverages displaying product advertising from outside vendors/sources shall not be brought into the cafeteria during meal service times. Board Policy 3.17.1
- We encourage you to visit with your children during special times, but we must adhere to these guidelines to ensure that we maintain our current status of providing a free breakfast and lunch to all the students in Tuscumbia City Schools.
